# ANIMEALS NEW INFRSHI

The AniMeals program has been keeping seniors together with their pets since 1984. All of us have seniors in our lives and may have, unfortunately, seen them struggle with loneliness and isolation. This is the very reason why a pet in our lives is so valuable. We know that for these struggling seniors, their pet is their reason to get out of bed each morning and is their sole source of companionship. When it comes to the difficult choice of whose health is more important, their pet will always come first. Fortunately, AniMeals has taken that painful choice away by ensuring that seniors and their pets get the nutrition they need for good health.

#### The number of beneficiaries receiving AniMeals has more than doubled in the last few years and we are now serving 616 companion animals every month right here in San Diego!

In addition to working with programs that serve low-income and home-bound seniors, such as Meal-On-Wheels and Jewish Family Services, we have also partnered with Wounded Warriors to serve injured soldiers and veterans and their service dogs. It's an honor for us to serve those that have risked their lives to serve our country.

Alongside our twelve partner agencies, the AniMeals program has served over two million free meals to keep seniors and disabled people with their loyal companions! That number represents so much more than just bags of cat food or dog food. To us here at the Center, it represents the gift of companionship, unconditional love, and additional years of quality life for clients and their pets.

Special thanks to our agency partners as well as our corporate partners at PETCO, Gelson's and Kahoots for helping us to bring this gift to so many in need. 😤







# VFTS

As animal lovers, we all know and appreciate the comfort and unconditional love that our pets provide us every single day. But what about those animal lovers that are stuck in hospitals without their loyal companion by their side? This is where the Pet Encounter Therapy (PET) program steps in. The program is led by two staff members with the help of 60 volunteers who visit skilled nursing facilities, children's centers, psychiatric units, and hospitals to provide clients with the emotional and tactile benefits of animals.

One of the most inspiring facilities the PET team has the pleasure of visiting twice a month is the VA San Diego Healthcare System, a hospital that provides services to more 82,000 Veterans in San Diego and Imperial Counties. The services veterans receive include medical, surgical, mental health, and rehabilitation services, in addition to highly anticipated biweekly visits from the therapy dogs at Helen Woodward Animal Center.

Sadie, a Labrador Retriever, and Hudson, a Miniature Grey Hound, love their job of interacting with the veterans and providing them with the many benefits of petting animals including relaxation, lower blood pressure, improved long and short term memory, and sensory stimuli.

Sadie and Hudson have a special way of connecting with every client in a unique and impactful way whether it is just feeling the warmth of their body against theirs, or having someone that is able to listen to their every thought without judgment.

We are truly grateful for the generosity of our Pet Encounter Therapy supporters. Without them, we would not be able to provide over 23,000 therapy animals interactions a year to facilities like the VA hospital.

# RAINING.

As kitten season quickly approaches, more and more kittens in need of your help and support are flooding into the Center.

On an early and rainy morning in March, an employee of a plumbing company found more than he anticipated at the bottom of a storm drain. What he thought would be a routine cleaning of the drain quickly turned into a rescue mission as the rain grew heavier. Eight feet down, he found three kittens still too young to open their eyes and no sign of their mother. The water level was quickly rising and he knew that if they were down there any longer, the kittens risked being swept away. He had to get them out of there quickly.

Once the kittens were free from danger, their rescuer immediately called a friend who knew about animal rescue and she, in turn, brought them to the Center for nursing care and treatment. A dedicated foster was more than willing to welcome them into the safety of her home to closely monitor them and provide them with constant bottle feedings.

#### It's because of your generous support that Helen Woodward Animal Center was able to save the lives of these beautiful babies.

Squash, Sushi, and Scone will spend the next few weeks with their foster mom, growing big and strong so they can have their spay/neuter surgeries and then start to look for their forever families. There's nothing but blue skies ahead for these kittens! 😤

# THF RESCUE!

We could not accomplish our goal of saving as many lives as possible without you, our amazing supporters and volunteers.

Late at night on Valentine's Day 2016, someone abandoned seven puppies – just a few hours old – at a Southern California shelter. When workers arrived the next morning, they found the hungry, helpless puppies. One of our rescue partners asked if we could take the seven newborns.

We quickly contacted one of our wonderful foster families that we knew would provide these little ones round-the-clock care. Because the puppies were so young, the fosters had to learn how to hold the puppies during feedings, how to make them latch, how to burp them, and everything else to ensure the puppies got the nutrition they needed.

Those first couple nights, they set their alarms to wake up every two hours to feed the puppies with an eye dropper. These kind, patient fosters are the only mothers the pups have ever known.

While we will never know what happened to their birth momor what compelled someone to abandon them in the middle of the night-we are lucky to have dedicated volunteers ready to give orphan newborns a second chance at life. 🏶
